A VIEW FROM THE PARSONAGE

After finishing up the book of Romans, we are ready to go to the Old Testament. The Old Testament is rich with the hints and whispers of the Messiah, Jesus. The Book of Isaiah is a great book to study.

The people of Israel and Judah were often in conflict with the Lord, rebelling against His laws and rejecting His love, so God sent Isaiah to declare their sins back to them, as well as the consequences. God told Isaiah to preach to the people, but knew they would not hear the truth. They would ignore him.

Though Israel will face the consequences of their rebellion, Isaiah's prophetic words are full of hope for the day when God would restore his people to Himself. This hope would be embodied through God's servant, "Immanuel," who one day He has established a new Spiritual Kingdom on

Earth. Isaiah's prophecies are fulfilled in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

Like Elijah, Jeremiah, and the other prophets, Isaiah was called by God to deliver His words to Israel. The book of Isaiah is filled with sobering accounts of Israel's sin and rebellion and warnings of their coming judgement. But along with warnings, Isaiah also offers a message of hope—a suffering servant, a coming Messiah, who would come to establish God's Spiritual Kingdom on Earth.

For generations, Isaiah's words have encouraged thousands of people who have waited in anticipation for the Messiah and for God to set right all that has been wronged through Jesus and the Spiritual Kingdom.

Read Isaiah 53 and be filled with joy. We are going to start the study of Isaiah and how it relates to Physical Israel and the Spiritual Israel today.

The fifth Gospel preaches the Gospel and puts Jesus first. Even if you miss some weeks, you can join anytime because we can get you up to speed.

MISSIONS

Grace continues to have a focused missions ministry, focusing on supporting, Local, Regional, and Global missions. Some of the local missions that Grace has supported over the last year are NEKCA, Area Churches Food Pantry and Soup Kitchen, as well as helping many individuals. Regionally, we support Berea Ministries (Camp Monadnock), and Globally supporting VIM and Samaritan's Purse. Grace has decided to gift \$200/month to ACWT Food Pantry.

SUGAR ON SNOW

Sugar on Snow was **SATURDAY August 3^{rd.}** This year was the 77th year! We served 112 platters, 75 hotdogs, 35 chili, a little bit of popcorn and water, and 13 dozen donuts. Net profit of \$1520.98 a little less then last year. Looking toward next year please let us know your thoughts on what could be better or what you really liked this year!
